

DREAMERS, Latin Culture Club Wins Golden Can Award

Food Pantry is Recipient of Collected Cans

Student Ambassador and Activity Board members hosted a sculpture competition Oct. 7 in Bogle Plaza. The sculptures had to be made out of canned goods, which would be donated to the college's food pantry.

The event was publicized through social media posts from SAAB's account, emails to club advisors and officers, and student announcements. The student body was encouraged to form groups and compete against each other to win the Golden Can and collect as many can donations as possible.

Teams started building their structures at 10 a.m. The structures remained on display until 2 p.m. the same day.

Sigma Kappa Delta, National Society of Leadership and Success, Latin Culture Club, and DREAMERS were the student clubs and organizations who participated in the event. The fundraiser was also supported by NWACC's Global Communities and IT departments.

The structure that won the contest as the most impressive was the product of a joint effort of two clubs on campus: DREAMERS and Latin Culture Club. Their design was the Mockingjay from the literary saga "The Hunger Games" accompanied by a sign that read "Hunger Is Not a Game."

When asked about the number of cans donated, Becky Hudson, Director of Student Life and Advisor for SAAB, said, "We had about 1,500 cans. Eight hundred and fifty of those were donat-
